INTERFAITH COMMUNITY SERVICES SELECTS NEW CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Interfaith Community Services (ICS), a nonprofit organization assisting Pima County, Arizona seniors, disabled individuals and people in financial crisis, is pleased to announce the appointment of Daniel Stoltzfus as the agency's new Chief Executive Officer, effective February 16, 2015.

Stoltzfus succeeds longtime ICS Chief Executive Officer Bonnie Kampa, who is retiring at the end of December 2014.

Stoltzfus' public service experience includes leadership positions with nonprofit organizations in Arizona, Colorado and the New York City metro area, as well as program development for a national behavioral health care company. Nearly 20 years of management experience with nonprofit organizations led him to his most recent role as the Chief Program Officer of The Bowery Mission, a historic faith-based institution serving homeless men and women along with at-risk youth in New York City.

From 2009-2013, Stoltzfus served as the Executive Director of Arizona Youth Partnership (AzYP), leading the organization through the founding of a charter school, a runaway/homeless youth shelter, and an innovative new program for low-income families known as Building Futures for Families. Prior to his service at AzYP, he was the Executive Director at New York City Relief, a mobile outreach to the homeless.

"Daniel brings a wealth of experience in the social services and nonprofit arenas to ICS and has earned a reputation as a visionary and seasoned leader," says Steve Pollyea, Chairman of the Board. "He shares a passion for our mission at ICS and brings a deep understanding of our community and of serving the needs of those most vulnerable. As ICS prepares to mark its 30th anniversary of service in 2015, Daniel is the right person to lead our organization into its next decade of growth."

"I am humbled to assume the helm of such a highly respected nonprofit organization as Interfaith Community Services (ICS)," says Stoltzfus. "I look forward to the opportunity to work with the board, staff and committed volunteers of ICS to build on the legacy of Bonnie Kampa's leadership and expand the impact of ICS throughout Pima County."

"Bonnie Kampa quickly became a mentor and trusted colleague when I came to Tucson in 2009 to lead Arizona Youth Partnership. After partnering with ICS on a federal grant project, I soon recognized the value the volunteers, staff, board and faith communities brought to the greater Tucson community. It is truly an honor to succeed Bonnie as the next CEO of Interfaith Community Services," he adds.

Stoltzfus earned a Masters of Public Administration (MPA) in nonprofit management and public policy from New York University's Wagner Graduate School of Public Service in May 2009. He and his wife Angela have four children.
